FROM OUR PASTOR

We live in a world that is louder than ever. Our days are filled with constant notifications, streaming media, and the pressure to always be connected. Silence has become uncomfortable, and stillness is often mistaken for inactivity.

The prophet Elijah stood on Mount Horeb expecting God to reveal Himself in dramatic ways. Yet the Lord was not in the wind, nor in the earthquake, nor in the fire. Instead, God came in a "tiny whispering sound"—a gentle, still voice. The original Hebrew expression, *qol demamah dakkah*, can be translated as "the sound of gentle stillness" or even "the sound of sheer silence." It reminds us that God's presence is not defined by dramatic displays of power, but by His quiet, faithful, and persistent love.

Perhaps one of the greatest spiritual challenges of our time is not that God has stopped speaking, but that we have stopped listening. We have lost the ability to sit quietly before the Lord. We fill every empty moment with noise, leaving little room for God to speak. Without silence, prayer becomes difficult, discernment becomes clouded, and our hearts become restless.

We often search for God in spectacular events while overlooking the quiet ways He is already speaking—in prayer, in Sacred Scripture, in the Eucharist, in the love of family and friends, and in the silent movements of our hearts. This week, let us intentionally create a few moments of silence each day. Turn off your phone for a few minutes. Sit quietly before the Blessed Sacrament. Take a peaceful walk without distractions. Open the Scriptures and simply listen. In those moments of gentle stillness, we may discover that God has been speaking to us all along.

DID YOU KNOW? - Characteristics of developmentally appropriate behaviors

It is important to distinguish normal, age-appropriate curiosity from concerning sexual behaviors that may be inappropriate or potentially abusive. In general, developmentally appropriate behaviors will be playful, curious, and will be enacted among similar age groups. While these behaviors are not ideal in play, and should be discussed with children, they are typically not causes for concern. These moments can also serve as opportunities to talk about boundaries, appropriate behaviors and safe adults. DE NUESTRO PARROCO

Vivimos en un mundo más ruidoso que nunca. Nuestros días están llenos de notificaciones constantes, redes sociales, medios digitales y la presión de estar siempre conectados. El silencio se ha vuelto incómodo, y la quietud suele confundirse con la inactividad.

El profeta Elías se encontraba en el monte Horeb esperando que Dios se manifestara de manera extraordinaria. Sin embargo, el Señor no estaba en el viento, ni en el terremoto, ni en el fuego. En cambio, Dios se hizo presente en el “murmullo de una brisa suave”, una voz serena y delicada. La expresión hebrea original, qol demamah dakkah, puede traducirse como “el sonido de una suave quietud” o incluso “el sonido del silencio absoluto”. Nos recuerda que la presencia de Dios no se manifiesta necesariamente en demostraciones espectaculares de poder, sino en su amor silencioso, fiel y constante.

Quizá uno de los mayores desafíos espirituales de nuestro tiempo no es que Dios haya dejado de hablar, sino que nosotros hemos dejado de escuchar. Hemos perdido la capacidad de permanecer en silencio ante el Señor. Llenamos cada momento libre con ruido y distracciones, dejando muy poco espacio para que Dios nos hable. Sin silencio, la oración se vuelve difícil, el discernimiento se oscurece y nuestro corazón permanece inquieto.

Con frecuencia buscamos a Dios en acontecimientos extraordinarios, mientras pasamos por alto las formas silenciosas en que Él ya nos está hablando: en la oración, en la Sagrada Escritura, en la Eucaristía, en el amor de la familia y los amigos, y en los movimientos silenciosos de nuestro corazón. Esta semana, hagamos el propósito de dedicar unos minutos cada día al silencio. Apaguemos el teléfono por un momento. Sentémonos en silencio ante el Santísimo Sacramento. Demos un paseo tranquilo sin distracciones. Abramos la Sagrada Escritura y simplemente escuchemos. En esos momentos de serena quietud, podremos descubrir que Dios nos ha estado hablando desde siempre.

Es importante distinguir entre la curiosidad normal en los niños y los comportamientos sexuales que pueden causar preocupación o que pueden ser potencialmente abusivos. En general, este tipo de comportamiento entre los niños debe ser juguetón, curioso y se realizará entre grupos de la misma edad. Aunque comportamientos sexuales no son un elemento ideal del juego normalmente no son motivo de preocupación, y si presentan una oportunidad para iniciar una conversación con el niño sobre los límites personales, comportamientos apropiados y quienes son personas de confianza.
